





## Descendants of the COA CrossBreeding Program and Chinook Breed Conservation Program

#### PR' GreatMountain Sindarin Rhoin x Vanguard North Brother Mtn

Sindarin (Sindy) descends the Chinook crossline that began with the New Founder dam, Glendon's Sweetie in 1993. North Brother (Brud) is a first generation pup from the first CBCP approved cross line produced in 2017. His sire is a Tamaskan and his dam is a Chinook who descends from the same Sweetie cross line.

#### COA CrossBreeding Program

In 1997, the Chinook Owners Association (COA) and United Kennel Club (UKC) launched a CrossBreeding Program with guidance from geneticist, Dr George Padgett.

The program, developed following the UKC recognition of the Chinook, focused on including in the registry those Chinook who were either known crosses or of unverifiable parentage. It also set as a goal to reduce the incidence of hip dysplasia in the breed.

There are modern purebred Chinooks who descend from three crosslines that began with breeding purebred Chinooks to the following:

- Siberian Husky
- Malamute hybrid
- Shepherd-Husky-Lab hybrid



#### 2017 Chinook Breed Conservation Program

In 2017, the COA approved the Chinook Breed Conservation Program (CBCP), in partnership with the UKC and informed by population geneticists.

The CBCP's goal is to "maintain a healthy, genetically sustainable Chinook population, with the breed's historical temperament, working ability, structure, and appearance."

New Founders introduced to date include:

- Tamaskan Dog
- Bernese Mountain Dog
- Labrador Retriever
- Seppala Siberian Sled Dog

First and second generation offspring have been produced so far through the CBCP.

Glendon's Sweetie, an outstanding lead dog, was born in the spring of 1987, her breeder was the accomplished musher, Paul Therriault (mushing and breeding winning sled dogs for over 30 years, winner of many sled races, 1988 Four Dog Amateur Champion). Sweetie's mother, Glendon's Princess Kyra, was an American Kennel Club registered German Shepard. Her father, Max, was a German Shepard-Labrador Retriever-Husky mix and was a gifted sled dog. Puppies from this breeding, including Sweetie, had tawny bodies and black masks, resembling the Chinook breed (see photo in upper left corner of this page).

When Sweetie was only 7 or 8 months old, Paul ran her on his team in part of the Trek for Life across Maine. She ran part of this race in lead. By the age of 10 months. Sweetie had distinguished herself as an exceptionally smart sled dog. Paul was running a predominantly Chinook team, quite an accomplishment for the Chinook breed. Paul has remarked that Sweetie was the best trained lead dog he ever had. She would turn on a dime in the middle of an open area upon hearing a gee or haw command.

Paul believes that dogs pass on genetic memory for sledding through breeding - that strong, solid sled dogs will produce strong, solid sled dogs. Paul bred Sweetie twice and the results produced evidence to support his theory. Paul helped Harry Gray (North Down Kennel, Waldoboro, Maine) develop a breeding plan, tracing pedigrees of the Chinook breed. In 1990, Paul gave Sweetie to Harry so Sweetie could be bred to purebred Chinooks. Sweetie was a good choice to breed into the Chinook line. Sweetie looked like a Chinook, was an outstanding working dog, had an excellent temperament, and possessed no known faults. She could add her natural drive and lead abilities to the Chinook line.

While at the North Down Kennel, Sweetie was bred to several purebred Chinooks, including Yukon Jack.


Timbermist's Yukon Jack was the product of a mating between Perry Greene Barrow and Alder Patch Oona.

Jack, a purebred Chinook, is recognized by the COA as part of the Chinook Breed foundation stock and registered with the United Kennel Club. It was important to make sure his contributions to the breed were captured and brought forward into future generations through various lines.

Jack had a affable personality and was described as a "heck of a musher" by one of his owners. He had a broad head, pricked ears and a thick, strong body. He was tawny with a buff mask. He produced several outstanding off-spring like Northdown Hootchinoo, Northdown Kaltag, Northdown Paleface, Northdown Oona.

Harry Gray of the Northdown Kennel states that Jack had no known health problems while in his kennel. He died in 1997 at 12 years of age of bone cancer. Though Sweetie produced many outstanding sled dogs, none of these Chinook hybrid lines were brought forward through a formal cross-breeding program until Northdown X Cheena (Sweey x Yukon Jack) was registered through the Chinook Owner's Association's (COA) Crossbreeding Program in 1998.

Chinooks of years gone by were motivated and strong sled dogs. Much of their motivation and size were lost when the Chinook numbers dwindled. Glendon's Sweetie, Dog Zero, was a proven working dog that resembled the Chinook breed, brought sledding drive into the Chinook line. Her line has been granted grandfather status as a recognized cross-line. Sweetie's off-spring have proven themselves as superb working dogs.









On January 14, 1993, Glendon's Sweetie gave birth to a litter of 7 puppies, including North Down X Cheena. It was reported that this was a dual sire litter with Timbermist's Yukon Jack and Helen Crater's Backroads Cujo. In 1995, both Sweetie and Cujo were DNA profiled. Cheena's DNA was submitted for profiling and parent verification in 1998. DNA parent verification concluded that Sweetie was Cheena's mother and Cujo was not her sire. Litter records indicated that Timbermist's Yukon Jack was the other possible father of Cheena. No DNA samples were taken from him prior to his death. However, he had produced another litter with North Wind Hoonah. Hoonah and two of her off-spring from that mating were DNA profiled. By conducting DNA parent verification, PE AgGen, the DNA laboratory used by the United Kennel Club, was able to determine what DNA Jack provided to the two off-spring. This information was then compared to Cheena. The laboratory concluded that "Timbermist's Yukon Jack would qualify as the sire of North Down Cheena".

Cheena was a uniformly tawny dog with a buff mask. She had a hint of black on her ears and muzzle. She had a broad head, strong neck, deep chest and a saber tail. Her ears were pricked and her dark brown eyes had the thoughtful Chinook expression. She was lean yet possessed a heavily muscled body with powerful thighs and hindquarters. Chinooks Worldwide has provided a pedigree for Cheena which supports the results of the DNA parent verification.



She had a straight top-line and excellent movement. People familiar with the Chinook breed often mistook her for purebred. Two of her outstanding characteristics were her snowshoe paws and her amazing speed.

Cheena was proof that by breeding a proven lead dog to a purebred Chinook the result was an excellent working Chinook Cross. Through the continuation of her line, strength and motivation will be added back into the Chinook gene pool.


Cheena produced GreatMountain's first litter with UKC GR CH, ARBA CH 'PR' WoodsRunner Duncan TT. Duncan was tawny colored, with a medium length coat. He had a black mask, black eye markings and nose. Duncan had expressive brown eyes and helicopter ears.

Duncan had been successful in the conformation ring, winning the 2000 UKC Chinook Top Ten competition and producing many show Champions and Grand Champions. Duncan ran in lead from 10 months of age on the WoodsRunner team, leading them in their successful completion of the Sandwich Notch 30. It was the first time in decades that a fully Chinook team has competed in that race. Athletically gifted to run, he was a solid worker. Duncan was an outstanding match to produce the next generation of this Cross Line.

By breeding Cheena with WoodsRunner Duncan, we hoped to capture the best of both dogs. Cheena's thick bone, broad chest, snowshoe paws and natural drive combined with Duncan's strong rear, thick coat, rich coloration, strong movement and working ability held the promise of offspring that would provide more proof for Paul Therriault's theory.

Cheena produced two beautiful puppies, North Trav'ler and Cedar Adahi, born on September 26, 1999. Both pups inherited great qualities from either side of their pedigree. Cheena was happy to have Trav'ler remain with her. Cedar lived nearby.

Trav'ler followed in the paw prints of her parents, grandparents and even great-grandparents as a hard-working sled dog. She was an honest working dog with high expectations of her fellow sled dogs. She ran in the wheel position for 9 years, pulling hard every time she wore a harness. Trav'ler took her last sled run of 5 miles at the age of 11 years. She did not want to retire.

I live on a Christmas tree farm. Friends came by and dropped an 18 foot balsam. We wrapped it in a blue tarp, tied ropes and sled lines to it. We brought in four younger dogs to pull the tree over the trail to our friends truck. I ran ahead to take photos of this sight. Trav'ler, age 13 by this time, ran free past the tree and alongside the 4 dog team pulling it, working her way through the sled lines til she was running between the two lead dogs, with their neckline stretched across her chest (photo below). She was an honest working dog.

Trav'ler was true to her name - a free spirit and the dog who was always leading the chase through the woods. She ran in large circles on our walks and continually demonstrated her natural athleticism, leaping over downed trees and gracefully running at full speed through thickly wooded lots. Trav'ler was a sensitive and gentle girl at home.

On the night she died, we lay on the floor on either side of her, spooning. We told her we loved her. The vet administered the injection and she was gone. Two months later, a psychic reported that Trav'ler told her to thank me for helping her to pass on saying, "I had a love sandwich. Who wouldn't want to die like that?"

In August 2004, Trav'ler was bred to UKC GR CH, ARBA CH 'PR' Saghalie's Kaniksu Reign. Rainy was a reliable sled dog, willing to be harnessed at any position in the team and beside any other familiar dog. Rainy pulled consistently and enthusiastically on the trail, showing virtually no signs of tiring before the completion of a run.



Rainy returned to the conformation ring at age 6, after a 3 year hiatus, to complete his UKC Championship in the first show. In 6 months he went on to win the championship class in 5 of 8 shows and was twice selected as Best of Breed, placing him in the top 10 nationwide among Chinooks as of November, 2004. In his final show in October 2004, he became a UKC Grand Champion and went on to win the Northern Breed Group.

Of the six males, all had two testicles descend, all seven pups are certified free of eye problems and all pups have had hips rated good or excellent.




GreatMountain X Yukon Charley, one of Trav'ler's seven pups, was the dam of the Mountain Litter with Hurricane Crispin's Soul. When Bob Jones (of WoodsRunner Chinooks) was asked if he could produce his ideal Chinook, what would that be, he pointed to Charley. Charley was a striking girl, with nice bone and a sweet, low key personality. She worked on the GreatMountain sled team, often in wheel. Charley had been named as the Best Chinook Cross in the 2006 Chinook National Specialty.

Crispin, owned by Elizabeth Johnson & Joyce Maley, lived in NY.

The litter includes 3 girls and 2 boys. All of the puppies in the litter were evaluated as breeding potential, with no structural faults noted. The puppies are incredibly uniform in appearance and type and 4 pups moved forward to be bred. These 4 were registered as purebred Chinooks by the United Kennel Club.



Mostly, she loved to be with her people and her pack.








One of Trav'ler's seven pups, GreatMountain X Tanacross, sired The Tribute Litter with Hurricane Nokomis Dream. Tanacross lived with John & Leslie Donais in NH. Tanacross was an outgoing, sweet boy. He worked well in harness, true to the tradition of sled dogs in his pedigree.

Nokomis worked on the GreatMountain sled team. She achieved her Championship title on the UKC show ring. Nokomis was a big girl, with impressive bone and fluid movement. She was a sweet, low key Chinook.

This litter represented seven years of work on our cross line and the pups that moved forward in breeding homes became registered as purebred Chinooks by the United Kennel Club. 
Calista achievements in the show ring bear evidence to her beautiful movement. Calista was selected as the 2015 UKC National Best of Breed. Calista won, NBOB again in 2016, a first in the breed.

Calista is a deep thinking problem solver with confidence. She is a beautiful Chinook ambassador and a super-sweet cuddler.

In the 2013 National Dog Show Calisata was interviewed by Mary Carillo, who was in love with Calista's mismatched ears, which are acceptable per the Chinook standard. Chinooks are working dogs, after all, and ears don't pull the sled! Calista is an honest worker in harness and has been awarded the Novice Sled Dog Certification from the Chinook Owners Association Working Dog Program. She also enjoys Rally Obedience, Nosework, and earned her Herding Instinct Certification (HIC).

Sindy is so sweet and silly—her people describe her as the ambassador of love and kisses. You couldn't find a more welcoming reception at any other B&B.



Sindy and Bashaba Nanuk had a litter of 7 Chinooks in July 2020.






# Vanguard North Brother Mtn 1st Generation
